



### What are the Roadblocks?


- CDOT made the initial capital investment, but there is no operating budget for "enhanced" maintenance
- The City of Chicago should be initiating maintenance
- The City makes the capital investment, but it's incumbent on the adjacent property owners to work with the City to make additional improvements – this is not communicated
- A Detached Way of Thinking Residents think that it is "someone else's" responsibility to make improvements to the public way
- Overall lack of momentum "It will always be that way..."





















### Awareness and Fundraising Campaign




